## Tax Package Introduced to Extend Biodiesel Credit and Oil Spill Liability Tax

Yesterday, Senate Finance Committee Chairman Chuck Grassley (R-IA) introduced legislation to

retroactively extend through 2019 the \$1 per gallon biodiesel tax credit that expired at the end of 2017. Additionally, the Oil Spill Liability Tax (OSLT) would be extended through 2019 and the

good news for petroleum marketers is that it would not be applied retroactively. For instance,

if the bill is signed into law in March, then the OSLT would be effective the first day of the first month following passage, which would mean April 1, 2019. Again, the prospects of passage depend on whether Congress can find a legislative vehicle to attach the tax extenders bill. At this time, it remains to be seen when that would happen, although, several House members have expressed their support for addressing tax extenders. The House plans to hold hearings on tax extenders in March.

Early this month, PMAA, NEFI and several other groups sent a letter to House and Senate leadership in support of a 2018 retroactive renewal of the \$1 per gallon biodiesel blender's tax credit, which expired on December 31, 2017. Further, the letter urges Congress to include a multi-year extension of the credit. Click here to view the letter and to urge your representatives

Additionally, PMAA and other groups sent a letter to Congressional tax writing committees to oppose the retroactive renewal of the OSLT and to renew only on a prospective basis after the

date of enactment. Applying an excise tax to 2019 transactions that have already been processed and the associated products sold multiple times would create significant transactional concerns and potential legal implications within the entire fuel supply chain. Click here to view the OSLT letter.
