Weight and Hour Waivers Expire at Noon Monday

As we reported on Monday, Governor McAuliffe issued a state of emergency in anticipation of the impending winter storm. It states the waivers (for weights and hours of service) shall remain in effect for 30 days from the onset of the disaster, or until emergency relief is no longer necessary, as determined by the Secretary of Public Safety and Homeland Security in consultation with the Secretary of Transportation, whichever is earlier. On Tuesday, we learned that VDOT and DMV had issued a separate order limiting the current weight and hours of service orders to five days. When we inquired why, their response was "the Department of Emergency Management always has the right to limit a waiver or even cancel a waiver prior to any date on a governor's declaration." FMCSA also advocates for limited time frames on waivers.

Therefore, please be advised that the current weight and hour waivers will expire at **noon Monday March 20**.
