## A Message to VPCGA Members from Virginia's Director or Emergency Management

A short time ago we were contacted by Dr. Jeffery Stern, the Commonwealth's Director of Emergency Management, asking that we forward the following message to the membership:

The Commonwealth is beginning preparations for Hurricane Matthew, which is expected to begin to arrive this weekend. It could have an impact on par with Hurricanes Floyd, Irene, and Isabel.

Due to the potential disruption of supply chains, and per best practice lessons from other hurricanes, I am requesting that local fuel station tanks be filled to capacity if possible by Friday to minimize fuel disruptions. If stations have generators or generator connections, please check those for function, as significant power outages are likely. A waiver for weight and time remains in place from Governor's Executive Order 59.
